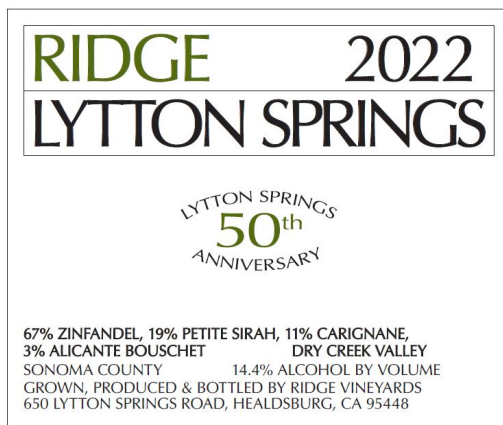
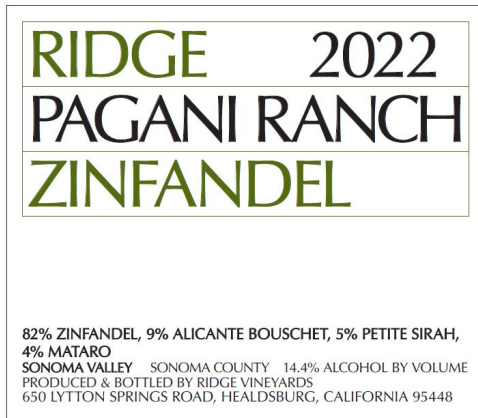


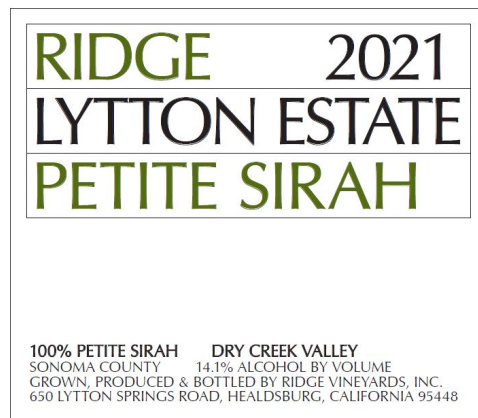
- Extremely Limited Availability
- Warm weather in August, especially at the higher elevations, expedited ripeness. The drought reduced yields by more than a third resulting in small berries with exceptional tannin and color concentration.
- Deep ruby color. Ripe mountain blackberry and cassis, anise, lavender, violets, sweet toasted oak and earthy, mineral components. Bold fruit at entry coupled with fine-grained tannins and firm acidity. Layered and complex mid palate with a long, intense finish. TG (4/23)

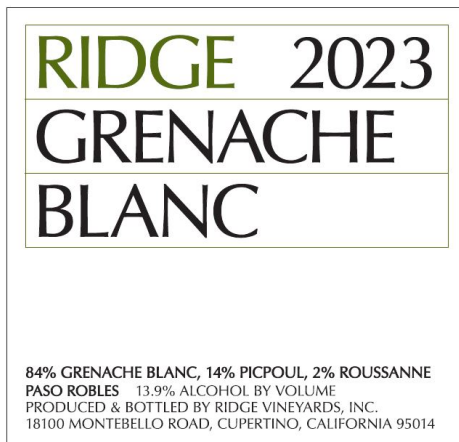
- Good Availability
- In 1972, Ridge made its first Lytton Springs from vines planted on the eastern half of the vineyard at the turn of the century. The vineyard is planted to zinfandel and its principal complementary varieties.
- Complex nose of boysenberry, cigar box, anise and sage. Full-bodied with well-coated tannins and balanced acidity. Notes of plum, blackberry, mineral, pepper and dark chocolate. SR (7/24)



- Good Availability
- Since 1991, Ridge has made zinfandel from the Pagani vineyard on the western side of Sonoma Valley. The majority of the vineyard was planted ninety to one hundred twenty years ago.
- Jammy black raspberry, orange zest and garrigue on the nose. Silky tannins and firm acidity. Flavors of blackberry, honeycomb and white pepper linger on the finish. SR (7/24)



- Very Limited Availability
- The oldest petite sirah vines on our Lytton Estate were planted in 1901 and the youngest in 2008. We made our first wine from the property in 1972. In 2002, we began bottling portions of the petite sirah as a separate wine for a limited release.
- Deep dark inky purple in color. Nose of freshly cracked pepper, ripe blackberry, violets, cocoa and minerality. Juicy blue and black fruit on the palate with well coated tannins and a lengthy finish. SR (2/23)



- Limited Availability
- Limestone soils and proximity to the Pacific provide ideal growing conditions for the grenache blanc to thrive. The grapes were pressed as whole clusters, fermented, and then aged on the lees for six months.
- Golden straw in color with aromas of pear, honeysuckle, pineapple, candied lime, tangerine, and wet stone. A bright and lively entry with a medium body layered with minerality and fresh natural acidity. The finish is long and satisfying. TG (2/24)
